

Ugadi/Gudi Padwa celebrations



March 18th Sunday

The name **Ugadi** is derived from the *Sanskrit words Yuga (age) and ādi (beginning): "the beginning of a new age"*. The Saka calendar begins with the month of Chaitra (March–April) and Ugadi marks the first day of the New Year. Chaitra is the first month in Panchanga which is the Indian calendar.

While the people of Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka use the term Ugadi for this festival, the people of Maharashtra term the same festival, observed on the same day, **Gudi Padwa** (Marathi:

). Marwari, people of Rajasthan celebrate the same day as their New Year day **Thapna**. Sindhis, people from Sindh, celebrate the same day as their New Year day **Cheti Chand**. Manipuris also celebrate their New Year (Sajibu nongma panba) on the same day. It is observed as **Baisakhi** in Punjab.

Recitation of Panchanga

People traditionally gather to listen to the recitation of the religious Panchanga of the New Year, and the general forecast of the year to come. This is called the 'Panchanga Shravana', an informal social function where the priest will read the New Year Panchanga. This year on Ugadi day,

come and visit the temple with your family and friends and take blessings of Lord, as well as take part in - Panchanga Shravana.
