

Tamil New Year Celebrations 2019









Sri Varasidhi Vinayakar Abhishekam 10:30 am Panchanga Padanam 12:00 noon followed by Traditional Lunch and Cultural Program

Tamil Puthaandu or New Year's Day falls on April 14h this year or Tamil month Chithirai 1st. The Tamil New Year of 2019-2020 is called "Vikari". The Tamil New Year, based on solar calendar begins on the vernal equinox, when Sun is deemed to enter into the constellation of Aries. People clean their homes, decorate it and draw Kolams in the front yard and inside with rice powder or rice paste. Mango leaves are tied with thread and hung over the doorways which are called Maavilai Thoranams.

Brass Lamps are cleaned and lit with cotton wicks. Women prepare a traditional lunch with rice, payasam, vadai, sambar, lentil and vegetables. A special dish called Mangai Pachadi is made with mango, neem flowers and jaggery to remind people of the mix of good and bad times in one's life. It's considered auspicious to visit the temple and worship God and pray for a great year ahead. The temples would have festive mood, and in some temples the Chariot of God (Thaer) is drawn by people.
